
Unique, Pet-Inclusive Travel Destinations




Does your pet deserve a getaway? If you're anything like most US pet parents who plan to travel with their dog or cat,* your answer is probably yes. If so, let's tour some unique, pet-inclusive destinations that might inspire you to book a pet-friendly trip.

Asheville, North Capolina

There's no better spot to start than Asheville, known as "Dog City, USA," according to Michael Poandl, public relations manager of the Explore Asheville Convention & Visitors Bureau. "Asheville is an extremely dog-friendly community," he says. "In fact, we sport the nation's first-of-its-kind 'dog welcome center' downtown."

But pets of the feline persuasion won't feel left out in Dog City. Alex Sinda, who resides in Asheville with Elvis, a whippet mix, and Jolene, a tabby mix, says, "If you're allowed to bring your



dog, chances are you could bring your cat too—if your cat is into the adventure lifestyle."

Throughout Asheville, pets can enjoy excursions like dining and shopping downtown with their favorite people, exploring lakes and hiking trails, touring historic sites, and attending special events throughout the year.

When they need a break from all that activity, families with dogs, cats, and other types of pets can find pet-friendly lodging like The Pines Cottages,



which features 4-acre grounds and a personal cottage or cabin for each Austin, Texas

Austin consistently ranks among the most pet-friendly US cities, and it's especially great for active families. Hiking

and biking trails throughout Austin welcome dogs and cats, and kayaking with pets is another popular activity.



"We love taking [black cat Chester Lamar] to the Greenbelt and Lady Bird Lake," Austin resident Feliza says. "It is important because


Bay Haybar, Maine In this coastal resort area, outdoor adventurers

outdoor adventurers can explore hiking trails, ponds, and beaches. In town, ice cream shops,

breweries, and other restaurants cater to pets, along with aptly named pet supply store Bark Harbor.



Maine-based photographer Heather Anderson and her pooch, Pippy, also enjoy Bar Harbor's special events, including the Early Bird Pajama Sale & Bed Races every November and the summertime Seaside Cinema outdoor movie showings. Heather says, "In addition to dogs, who are by far the most popular pet to visit the area, it's not uncommon to see cats, bunnies, ferrets, and even turtles out and about in Bar Harbor. Last summer, I actually saw a woman 'wearing' a snake while she was shopping."



Una, a Scottish fold, and Woodford, a British shorthair, are 2 cats who frequent Bar Harbor's trails and beaches and like paddleboarding, swimming, and camping while visiting. "Una and Woody love going on trips in the car and hiking, so instead of leaving them at home all the time, I will take them with me," savs Izzv





Courtemanche from Franklin, Maine. "Most people are very surprised when they see them walking the trails and most of the time mistake them for dogs at first."

Cólórado Springs Area, Cólórado

Outdoorsy petfriendly fun abounds around Colorado Springs. Like most places on our list,



this area has plentiful hiking trails and parks, plus everything from dining to shopping locales that permit pets. But it also boasts some really unique experiences.

who owns and operates Colorado Jeep Tours and the website RoyalGorge.info. Many of his Jeep tours help people and pets spend time outdoors together. "Most dogs enjoy the adventure of getting out of the yard and experiencing all the smells nature has to offer," he says. "And all parents love to see their fur babies get excited to experience something new."



Another adventure that awaits human and pet travelers is the Manitou Cliff Dwellings, where people and their leashed pets can explore ancient Puebloan ruins and museums displaying cultural artifacts. "It is good to include pets on your outings as they are very much a part of many families," says general manager Michele Hefner. "In most cases, the other visitors love having the opportunity, with permission, to interact with people's pets. It makes for happy visitors."

Mendocino County, California
This West Coast destination

This West Coast destination prides itself on being truly pet inclusive—from transportation to luxury dining and lodging accommodations. One such example is the Stanford Inn by the Sea

eco-luxury resort. Just some of its pet-friendly touches include an area for guests and their pets to dine together, bowls and house-made treats in guest rooms, and even Catch a Canoe with outriggers that pets can board to travel up scenic Big River.



"Pets are a part of our family and add to our enjoyment of life," says Joan Stanford, the resort's owner and innkeeper



along with her husband, Jeff. "If we leave them behind, we miss them and are happy to see other folks with their pets."

Jane Wicklund, who has stayed at the resort with her husband, Rick, and their dogs, says that Hadley, their sweet golden retriever (and, previously, their dog Maggie) always enjoys their visits to Stanford Inn. "She feels most welcome
